The Electronic Systems Technician (EST) program prepares students to work with low-voltage applications in both residential and commercial settings. ESTs install and maintain a variety of complex electronic systems, including security, fire, telecommunications, and audio/video.

Individuals who complete the EST Registered Apprenticeship program, which consists of three years of classroom instruction and 8,000 hours of onthe-job training with an apprentice sponsor, are eligible to earn a Journeyperson credential through the Delaware Department of Labor.
